

# Women in Congress, 1917-2020: Service Dates and Committee Assignments by Member, and Lists by State and Congress

## Summary

In total 396 women have been elected or appointed to Congress, 258 Democrats and 138 Republicans. These figures include six nonvoting Delegates, one each from Guam, Hawaii, the District of Columbia, and American Samoa, and two from the U.S. Virgin Islands, as well as one Resident Commissioner from Puerto Rico. Of these 396 women, there have been

- 338 (222 Democrats, 116 Republicans) women elected only to the House of Representatives;
- 41 (25 Democrats, 16 Republicans) women elected or appointed only to the Senate; and
- 17 (11 Democrats, 6 Republicans) women who have served in both chambers.

A record 148 women were initially sworn in for the 117<sup>th</sup> Congress. Since then, two House Members have resigned, four new House Members have been sworn in, one Senator resigned, and one Senator's appointed term expired.

Of 148 women currently in Congress, there are

- 24 in the Senate (16 Democrats and 8 Republicans);
- 120 Representatives in the House (89 Democrats and 31 Republicans); and
- 4 in the House (2 Democrats and 2 Republicans) who serve as Delegates or Resident Commissioner, representing the District of Columbia, American Samoa, the U.S. Virgin Islands, and Puerto Rico.

This report includes brief biographical information, committee assignments, dates of service, district information, and listings by Congress and state, and (for Representatives) congressional districts of the 396 women who have been elected or appointed to Congress. It will be updated when there are relevant changes in the makeup of Congress.

### Introduction

On November 9, 1916, Jeannette Rankin (R-MT) was elected to the House of Representatives as Montana's Representative-at-Large to the 65<sup>th</sup> Congress (March 4, 1917-March 4, 1919). This election win gave Representative Rankin the distinction of being the first woman elected to serve in Congress. The first woman to serve in the Senate was Rebecca Latimer Felton (D-GA). She was appointed in 1922 and served for one day.

Three hundred ninety-six women have been elected or appointed to Congress.<sup>2</sup> These figures include six nonvoting Delegates, one each from Guam, Hawaii, the District of Columbia, and American Samoa, and two from the U.S. Virgin Islands, as well as one Resident Commissioner from Puerto Rico. Of these 396 women, there have been<sup>3</sup>

- 258 Democrats and 138 Republicans;
- 338 (222 Democrats, 116 Republicans) women elected only in the House of Representatives, including 7 (4 Democrats, 3 Republicans) women who have served as Delegates or Resident Commissioners in the House;<sup>4</sup>
- 41 (25 Democrats, 16 Republicans) women elected or appointed only in the Senate; and
- 17 (11 Democrats, 6 Republicans) women elected or appointed in both chambers.

A record 148 women were initially sworn in for the 117<sup>th</sup> Congress. Three have since resigned, four new arrivals have been sworn in, and one Senator's appointed term expired.<sup>5</sup> This is higher than the previous record from the 116<sup>th</sup> Congress (131 women initially sworn in, 1 woman in the House subsequently resigned, 2 women were appointed to the Senate, and 1 of those Senate appointments expired before the end of the Congress). Of the 148 women currently in Congress, there are

- 24 in the Senate (16 Democrats and 8 Republicans);
- 124 in the House (91 Democrats and 33 Republicans); including

Throughout this report, House and Senate totals each include one woman elected but not sworn in or seated due to the House or Senate being out of session. Both women are included in various official congressional publications, including, for example, the *Biographical Directory of the United States Congress* (http://bioguide.congress.gov), "Women in Congress" (http://history.house.gov/Exhibition-and-Publications/WIC/Women-in-Congress) and "Senators of the United States 1789-present: a chronological list of senators since the First Congress in 1789," maintained by the Senate Historical Office (http://www.senate.gov/artandhistory/history/resources/pdf/chronlist.pdf).

One woman was sworn into the House in February 2021 (after a delay in the certification of her election), another in April 2021, another in June 2021, and another in November 2021. The term of one appointed female Senator expired in January 2021, and another female Senator resigned in January 2021 to become Vice President of the United States. Two female House Members resigned in March 2021 to become Cabinet Secretaries.

• 4 women in the House who serve as Delegates or Resident Commissioner (2 Democrats and 2 Republicans), representing the District of Columbia, American Samoa, the U.S. Virgin Islands, and Puerto Rico.

#### The total also includes

- 27 African American women, 11 Asian Pacific American women, 16 Hispanic women, and 2 Native American women; and
- 6 women who chair House standing committees, 4 women who chair Senate standing committees, and 1 woman who chairs a House select committee. Two of these committee chairs, one in each chamber, also chair a Joint Committee related to their service as chair of a House or Senate committee.

Other notable facts about women in the 117<sup>th</sup> Congress include the following:

- Not including Delegates and the Resident Commissioner, women currently hold 120 (27.6%) seats in the House of Representatives and 24 (24%) seats in the Senate, totaling 144 (26.9%) of the 535 voting seats in the 117<sup>th</sup> Congress.
- Including Delegates and the Resident Commissioner, women currently hold 124 seats in the House of Representatives, increasing the total to 148 seats (27.4%) held by women in the entire Congress.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>6</sup> Prior to the adoption of the Twentieth Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, effective Oct. 15, 1933, the terms of Representatives and Senators began on March 4, in conformance with a resolution of the Continental Congress implementing the Constitution (adopted Sept. 13, 1788). The Twentieth Amendment provides inter alia that the terms of Representatives and Senators shall commence at noon on January 3, in the year following their election. The first Congress affected by the Twentieth Amendment was the 74<sup>th</sup> (1935-1937). Members elected to fill a vacancy are sworn in and commence their terms as soon as possible, as do Senators appointed to fill a vacancy.
